What Is Eyelid Surgery?

Eyelid surgery (eyelid lift), is known medically as *blepharoplasty* (pronounced: blef-aR-o-plas-tee), and addresses droopy upper eyelids that may interfere with vision (upper blepharoplasty) and lower eyelid bagging and wrinkling (lower blepharoplasty).


Blepharoplasty is most often performed on both upper and lower eyelids together. This gives patients a balanced and harmonious result and is also more cost and recovery time efficient.


Blepharoplasty is a high art. Achieving an attractive aesthetic outcome that is natural and youthful is one of the most challenging tasks in plastic surgery. Detailed knowledge of the complex network of facial muscles, facial nerves, and facial blood vessels, especially those near the highly sensitive eye, is the domain of a super-specialized surgeon, not a general plastic surgeon.

The classic reference about the eyes being the windows to the soul, is emblematic of the importance of our eyes and how we relate to the world. According to noted Psychology Professor, Dr. Paul Ekman, of the 43 facial muscles most are connected to the eye brows, upper eyelids or lower eyelids. These muscles are responsible for





the way we express our human emotion. It is important to find a doctor that is passionate about helping people achieve their own facial aesthetic goals and the consideration of the aesthetic eyes as the most critical element to "get it right" for patients considering any facial rejuvenation including blepharoplasty.

Although it is not possible to get Elizabeth Taylor's or Angelina Jolie's eyes, every patient has their own natural beauty which can be enhanced by undoing some of the things "father time" has put upon us. Those pesky effects of aging that have caused puffiness, sags, droopiness, & wrinkles to degrade our natural youthful beauty can be improved by a skilled surgeon with that magic combination of a conservative but confident technique.

Thus it is critical to identify a doctor with extensive surgical experience in blepharoplasty surgery and achieving excellent results patient after patient. Consistent results can help patients feel more at ease in making (and living with) these important surgical decisions.

What Blepharoplasty Can Do

In the hands of a skilled facial plastic surgeon, patients can expect blepharoplasty to address several important aesthetic and functional concerns. Some of the most troublesome elements that can be addressed are:

- Elimination of excess skin.
- Elimination of excess fatty deposits that cause a puffy appearance.
- Bags under the eyes can be reduced or eliminated.
- Droopy eyelids that may interfere with vision can be corrected.
- Asymmetry between left and right eyelid appearance can be reduced.

The most disturbing element of having one or more of the items above is that often it changes our projected appearance to looking sad, mad, or tired. When this happens our friends and coworkers can actually treat us differently. Other times it is as simple as looking much older than the age we feel. During your consultation, it is important that the surgeon give you an honest assessment of your condition and your options, and provide you with all the information you need to make an informed decision.

Finding an expert at addressing these issues produces results that can feel life transforming.

The Laser Difference

Laser blepharoplasty is one of the most advanced plastic surgery procedures being done today only by a small number of superspecialized facial plastic surgeons nationwide.

For those patients with appropriate skin type of Fitzpatrick 3 or 4 and less, as determined by your surgeon, the laser can be used with excellent safety and efficacy.

Laser blepharoplasty uses the laser as a precision super-fine, pin-point laser scalpel to make incisions that have favorable wound healing, for minimal scaring. The laser is also used in scanning mode to resurface the lower eyelid, which causes the skin to tighten and be rejuvenated. The laser provides superior aesthetic outcomes for the most natural youthful look.

Asian Blepharoplasty

According to Dr. H.S. Hwang, "Asian individuals pursue cosmetic eyelid surgery not so much to 'Westernize' their eyes, but rather to appear more open-minded, energetic, and youthful." This surgery is very common because 50% of Eastern and Southeastern Asian woman were born without a supratarsel crease (double eyelid).

The Risks of Laser Blepharoplasty

Generally all surgery carries some risk, however the risks associated with blepharoplasty and laser blepharoplasty are low. One factor is the lower risk of not requiring general anesthesia but rather using monitored anesthesia care (MAC). During MAC sedation, you continue to breathe on your own and do not have a breather tube. It is important for patients to read and understand the informed consent document and engage the doctor with any questions before surgery. All questions regarding patient safety should be considered and addressed by the doctor with respect and empathy for the patient while providing information on medical risks that is understandable.

Surgical Recovery from Blepharoplasty

Patients who receive laser blepharoplasty are often surprised that it is easier than they expected, and with less pain. Some bruising and swelling is expected; however, the diligent application of the doctor's instructions, including simple icing techniques, are helpful in reducing these effects.

Patients should avoid excess bending, heavy lifting or vigorous activity for at least 10 days. After an upper blepharoplasty, the stitches are removed at the end of the week and makeup can then be applied. Typically Dr. Yeilding's lower blepharoplasty patients do not need stitches.

Make sure you have a friend or family member provide transportation for you to and from the surgery center. Smoking is not allowed during recovery from blepharoplasty surgery as your ability to heal rapidly and without scaring depends on your blood supply and smoking constricts capillaries that are critical to good healing.
